DECISION

S & P GANESH, INC. DBA ST'S GENERAL STORE 110 MENDON STREET UXBRIDGE, MA 01569 LICENSE#: 130400037

VIOLATION DATE: 04/02/2014

S & P Ganesh, Inc. dba St's General Store (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, June 17, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Kujawski's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and
- 2. Investigator Kujawski's Investigative Report dated April 2, 2014.
- A. Copy of Training Course and Certification.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On Wednesday, April 2, 2014, at approximately 5:20 p.m., Investigators Keefe and Kujawski conducted an investigation of the business operation of S & P Ganesh, Inc. dba St's General Store.
- 2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased a can of Budweiser Light beer for two dollars and ninety nine cents (\$2.99). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) — Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 — Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
