WHEREAS, Valerie Cocatrix-Simon, (or the "Licensee"), a licensed mortgage loan originator under Massachusetts General Laws chapter 255F, section 2, has been advised of the right to Notice and Hearing pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws chapter 30A, section 10 and chapter 255F, section 11, and having waived those rights, entered into a STIPULATION AND CONSENT TO THE ISSUANCE OF A CONSENT ORDER ("Consent Agreement") with representatives of the Division of Banks ("Division") dated <u>September 20</u>, 2010, whereby, solely for the purpose of settling this matter, Valerie Cocatrix-Simon agrees to the issuance of this CONSENT ORDER ("Consent Order") by the Commissioner of Banks ("Commissioner");

WHEREAS, The Division of Banks ("Division"), through the Commissioner, has jurisdiction over the licensing and regulation of persons engaged in the business of a mortgage loan originator in Massachusetts, pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws chapter 255F, section 2;

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WHEREAS, Valerie Cocatrix-Simon is, and at all relevant times has been, a

Massachusetts licensed mortgage loan originator doing business in the Commonwealth;

WHEREAS, on August 9, 2010, the Division issued a TEMPORARY ORDER TO

CEASE AND DESIST, Docket No. 2010-265 (the "Temporary Order"), against Valerie

Cocatrix-Simon based upon the Licensee's failure to demonstrate completion of the pre-

licensing education certification process through the Nationwide Mortgage Licensing System

(NMLS), in violation of Massachusetts General Laws chapter 255F, section 5 and the

Division's regulation 209 CMR 41.04(2)(e); failure to obtain a passing score on the

Massachusetts component of the SAFE Mortgage Loan Originator Test, in violation of

Massachusetts General Laws chapter 255F, section 6(a) and the Division's regulation 209

CMR 41.04(2)(f); failure to obtain a passing score on the National component of the SAFE

Mortgage Loan Originator Test, in violation of Massachusetts General Laws chapter 255F,

section 6(a) and the Division's regulation 209 CMR 41.04(2)(f); failure to complete a request

for a criminal background check through the NMLS, in violation of Massachusetts General

Laws chapter 255F, section 3(a) and the Division's regulation 209 CMR 41.04(2)(c). The

Temporary Order is incorporated herein, in its entirety, by reference.

WHEREAS, Valerie Cocatrix-Simon filed a response to the Temporary Order with

the Division and attested that she has discontinued engaging in the activities of a residential

mortgage loan originator in Massachusetts and desires to surrender her Massachusetts

mortgage loan originator license;

WHEREAS, the parties now seek to resolve this matter by mutual agreement; and

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WHEREAS, in recognition of the Division and Valerie Cocatrix-Simon having

reached the following mutual agreement under this Consent Order to resolve this matter, the

Commissioner has terminated the Temporary Order on this <u>20th</u> day of <u>September</u>,

2010.

ORDER

NOW COME the parties in the above-captioned matter, the Division and Valerie

Cocatrix-Simon, and stipulate and agree as follows:

1. Valerie Cocatrix-Simon attests that she has ceased engaging in the activities of

a mortgage loan originator in Massachusetts, as those activities are defined under

Massachusetts General Laws chapter 255F, section 1 and the Division's regulation 209 CMR

41.00 et seq., relative to any residential property in Massachusetts.

2. Immediately upon the execution of this Consent Agreement, the Division will

update Valerie Cocatrix-Simon's licensing status in Massachusetts through the NMLS to

"Surrendered."

3. To the extent that Valerie Cocatrix-Simon wishes to resume business in

Massachusetts as a mortgage loan originator at any time hereafter, Valerie Cocatrix-Simon

shall be required to submit a completed application to obtain the relevant license from the

Commissioner. The Commissioner shall have all of the discretion set forth within General

Laws chapter 255F, section 4 and the Division's regulation 209 CMR 41.00 et seq. in

determining whether to issue a license to Valerie Cocatrix-Simon to conduct the licensed

business, provided however, that any such application shall not be denied solely on the basis

of the Temporary Order.

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4. The provisions of this Consent Order shall not limit, estop, or otherwise

prevent any other state agency or department, from taking any other action affecting Valerie

Cocatrix-Simon.

5. This Consent Order shall become effective immediately upon the date of its

issuance.

6. In accordance with the terms of the Consent Agreement entered by Valerie

Cocatrix-Simon and the Commissioner, Valerie Cocatrix-Simon has waived all rights of

appeal relative to the Temporary Order.

7. The provisions of this Consent Order shall remain effective and enforceable

except to the extent that, and until such time as, any provisions of this Consent Order shall

have been modified, terminated, suspended, or set aside by the Commissioner or upon an

order of a court of competent jurisdiction.

8. This Consent Order and the Consent Agreement are the complete documents

representing the resolution of this matter. There are no other agreements, promises,

representations, or warranties other than those set forth in this Consent Order, which replaces

and supersedes all prior agreements between Valerie Cocatrix-Simon and the Commissioner.
