## Biosecurity for Vehicles

**Vehicles can carry disease vectors from one location to the next.  
Vehicles spread disease by transporting manure, flies and dust.  
Prevent the spread of disease by following these steps:**

- **Park** away from animal areas whenever possible.
- **Vehicle Tires and Wheel Wells** must be clean and free of visible manure on the tires and wheel wells.
- **Exterior Bed of Vehicle/Trailer** must be clean and dry; cleaned and disinfected after each use.
- **Interior of Vehicle** should be easily cleanable and must be kept clean.
- **Operator of Vehicle**, in contact with animals, should wear protective coveralls and boots. At no time should you enter your vehicle in dirty coveralls or boots. If using disposable gear, a new set must be worn at each new location. If using cloth coveralls and rubber boots, a clean pair of coveralls should be worn at each location and rubber boots should be cleaned and disinfected after each use.
- **Vehicle Equipment** and/or any items used for animal vaccination, tagging, handling, to carry equipment on site, clipboards, etc, and farm implements, should all be cleaned and disinfected before movement to a different animal facility.



**Disinfectant does not work on a dirty surface.  
Items to be disinfected must be cleaned first  
with hot soapy water then disinfected.**
