Verizon MA understands columns 2 and 4 of the chart as asking for Verizon's position on whether sections 251 and 252 of the Act would apply to a contract governing the terms and conditions on which traffic is exchanged in each of the scenarios described. Verizon MA objects to this request on the grounds that columns 2 and 4 call for legal conclusions, and on the grounds that all lines other than line 1 on page 1 seek information and Verizon MA's legal position on scenarios that are not before the Department in this proceeding and are therefore not relevant to the subject of this proceeding. Verizon MA further objects to the column labelled "Non-Local Traffic" on the grounds that it is overly vague, in that it does not specify the type of non-local traffic at issue. Verizon MA understands this column to refer to interstate, interLATA traffic, *i.e.* long distance traffic.


