State-supplied vaccines and screening for the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program

What are state-supplied vaccines?

MDPH makes vaccines available to all health care provider sites for the immunization of any child under 19 years of age using state funding for privately insured children and federal funding from the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program for Medicaid-eligible and other children who meet VFC eligibility. State supplied vaccines can only be used according to the most recent versions of the Childhood Vaccine Availability Table.

Why is it important to verify and document VFC eligibility correctly?

Providers are <u>required</u> to verify and document VFC Eligibility at <u>every</u> immunization visit for anyone less than 19 years of age. *If screening and documenting are not done correctly, this can be considered fraud.*

REMEMBER: With the exception of MenB vaccine, all children in the state of Massachusetts, regardless of eligibility status, from birth through the day before their 19th birthday are eligible for **STATE-SUPPLIED** vaccines. Refer to the most recent Childhood Vaccine Availability Table for additional information.

How do I verify VFC eligibility?

VFC providers may check for VFC eligibility when patients check-in at reception or in the exam room.

VFC eligibility criteria are outlined below:

Enrolled in Medicaid: A child eligible for Mass Health or Medicaid,		
including Medicaid HMO's.	VFC Eligible - Medicaid

Private Insurance: A child has a private health insurance such as Blue Cross		
Blue Shield, Harvard Pilgrim, Tufts, Cigna, Tricare, Aetna, etc.	Not VFC Eligible	
→ This list is not exhaustive; there are other private health insurance	1400 VI C LIIGIDIC	
companies. When in doubt, check with your billing office.		

Where do I document VFC Eligibility?

The outcome of the VFC screening and verification must be documented and dated. VFC eligibility is documented using a paper hardcopy VFC Eligibility Screening Form or the Electronic Health Record (EHR).

If your office does not use an EHR, paper VFC Eligibility forms should be kept in the patient's chart. Each subsequent immunization visit should be documented on this form.

Many EHRs have created internal drop-down menus offering several options for VFC eligibility. To establish consistency, this table shows the only options to be selected when documenting VFC eligibility in an EHR in MA:

Eligibility Categories	Electronic Health Record Drop Down Selections
Medicaid/Mass Health	VFC Eligible- Medicaid
Uninsured	VFC Eligible- Uninsured
American Indian/ Alaskan Native	VFC Eligible- American Indian/Alaskan Native
Underinsured	VFC Eligible- Underinsured
Private Insurance	NOT VFC ELIGIBLE

[→] The use of <u>any other options</u>, including, but not limited to: *state specific eligible, local specific eligible, unknown* or names of other specific programs is **not acceptable** in Massachusetts.
