any additional extensions. ("The Board may renew a temporary permit for a maximum of six months for candidates who have obtained a passing score in a Board approved international veterinary graduate examination. A temporary permit shall not exceed 12 months, including any extensions.")

• Vet Tech Scope [Jeff Kaplan] – Veterinary Technicians can draw blood without veterinary supervision. Board requests draft policy for technician supervision and delegation for review at upcoming meeting.
