Daily	 <b>SELF-GUIDED STORYWALK®</b> <b>Henry Works By D.B. Johnson</b> <b>Posted on the Woods Path Trail</b> Read about and see what Henry David Thoreau did during his two year stay at Walden! Posted on the Accessible Trail to the Thoreau House Site, a level 1/2 mile, crushed stone surface trail. Sundays & Wednesdays Except 27th	 <b>Summer Saunter 1:00—2:30pm</b> <b>Meets at Visitor Center.</b> Join a Park Interpreter for a 1/2 mile walk to Thoreau’s original house site, where you will look, listen, and make note of your observations in the natural world like Henry did. Come learn about Thoreau’s thoughts and feelings about the summer season. Wear good boots. Ages 10 and up.
Sundays & Wednesdays Except 27th	 <b>Excavation at Walden 10:00am—12:00pm</b> <b>Meets at Thoreau House Site</b> Meet a Park Interpreter at the site of Thoreau’s famous two-year sojourn to learn about the Archeologist Roland Wells Robbins and his rediscovery of the House Site during these ongoing 10-minute talks. All ages.
Tuesdays	 <b>Reading Walden’s Landscape 1:00—2:00pm</b> <b>Meets at Visitor Center.</b> Take a closer look at the forested landscape on this easy 1-hour, 1/2-mile walk with a Park Interpreter. Learn how to read a forest’s history and its future based on the current composition and age of tree species. Another 1/2 mile to return. Ages 8 and up.
Saturdays Except 19th	<b>The Beavers Are Back! 2:30—4:00pm</b> <b>Meets at Visitor Center.</b> Join a Park Interpreter for this guided 1.5 to 2 mile walk to Heywood’s Meadow. You will hear about beavers, and how they are vital to the ecosystem at Walden Pond. Wear good boots. Binoculars encouraged! Ages 10 and up.
Thursdays Except 10th	<b>Walking Walden 1:00—2:30pm</b> <b>Meets at Visitor Center.</b> Join a park interpreter and explore the sites that inspired naturalist and writer Henry David Thoreau during his two-year stay at Walden. Wear good boots. Ages 10 and up.
Thursdays Fridays Saturdays Except 4th & 12th	 <b>Thoreau House Talks 10:00am—12:00pm</b> Swing by the Thoreau <b>House Replica</b> to learn about naturalist Henry David Thoreau during these ongoing 10-minute talks with a Park Interpreter. All ages.
