DECISION

MARCHARD ROBERT AND GLEE DBA WALES PACKAGE STORE 67 MAIN ST **WALES, MA 01081** LICENSE#: 131200002

VIOLATION DATE: 03/05/2014

HEARD: 12/2/2014

Marchard Robert and Glee dba Wales Package Store (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, December 2, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) -Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 - Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Keefe's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and

2. Investigator Keefe's Compliance Check Field Report dated March 5, 2014.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS

- 1. On Wednesday, March 5, 2014, at approximately 5:34 p.m., Investigators Kujawski and Keefe conducted an investigation of the business operation of Marchard Robert and Glee dba Wales Package Store.
- 2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage, a can of Budweiser Light beer for three dollars and twenty cents (\$3.20). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. The Commission took administrative notice of the Licensee's records and notes that this violation is the second compliance check that the Licensee failed within six years. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for six (6) days of which six (6) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
