 To provide background information about the Watertown-Cambridge Greenway Project, now at a conceptual stage of design


To obtain public input.



Watertown - Cambridge Greenway Vision

- Creation of a multi-use greenway, using the former B&M railroad right-of-way extending from Concord Avenue in Cambridge, through the Fresh Pond Reservation, under Huron Avenue and Mount Auburn Street and into Watertown.
- Completion of an important regional connection linking the Charles River path system, the Minuteman Bikeway, the Alewife Greenway and the Mystic River Reservation into an interconnected off-road pathway network.

Regional Bicycle Map






Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan Background

- MAPC Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan was completed early in 1997
- Massachusetts Statewide Bicycle Transportation Plan in 1998
- Boston MPO & MAPC completed an updated Regional Bicycle Plan in 2007
- Broad pubic support and advocacy from local bicycle & pedestrian committees for the past 20 years.



Segment 1



- DCR acquired the land from School Street to Grove Street in November 2000.
- Segment 1 was constructed 2010 and 2011 from School Street to Arlington Street, including spur to Arsenal Street.






Possible Access Points for Segment 2

- Water Purification Facility Entrance





Project Design Elements

- 14 to 16 foot wide path (10 to 12 feet paved, with two-foot shoulders)
- Multi–use path, ADA compliant
- 3 feet clear width from vertical obstructions
- Grass drainage swales
- Landscape and interpretive elements
- Underpass lighting at Mount Auburn Bridge



Project Design Elements





Cambridge Review Process for Design – Summer/Fall 2015

- Staff Interdepartmental Working Group Review
- Review by: Fresh Pond Master Plan Advisory Committee, Bicycle Committee, Pedestrian Committee
- Review and Approval by Water Board
- Review and Approval by Conservation Commission.

Design & Construction Schedule

- Survey to be completed in June 2015
- Greenway design started June 2015
- Next Public Meeting (at 25% Design) Fall 2015
- Environmental permitting: Cambridge Conservation Commission Hearing – Fall/Winter 2015
- State Highway Access permit for Bridges Fall 2015
- Design scheduled to be completed by Spring 2016
- Construction to begin Summer 2016 (pending funding availability.)
