DECISION

**JAROSZ PACKAGE STORE INC. D/B/A NIPMUCK LIQUORS
35 THOMPSON ROAD

Jarosz Package Store Inc. d/b/a Nipmuck Liquors (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission" or "ABCC") held a hearing on Tuesday, October 24, 2017, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, § 34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Keefe's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Investigator Keefe's Compliance Check Field Report; and
2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

A. TIPS Certificate for K. Lepage.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS

1. On Monday, June 26, 2017, at approximately 6:12 p.m., Investigators Di Cicco and Keefe ("Investigators") investigated the business operation Jarosz Package Store Inc. d/b/a Nipmuck Liquors.
2. An underage operative, working with Investigators, purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, a can of Coors Light beer for one dollar and forty-seven cents (\$1.47). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, § 34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for a period of three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
