Massachusetts currently ranks first for the rate of persons with one or more doses per capita among states with populations of five million people or more.







## Individuals with at Least One Dose



#### Vaccination status of individuals by age group (cumulative)




#### Percent of population with at least one dose



Vaccination status is reported at the age at which the vaccine was administered. Individuals transition into older age groups over time keeping aggregate totals consistent across the sum of all age categories. \*Unvaccinated/unreported vaccination individuals: This is the population estimate for the subpopulation minus the number of people who received at least one dose of vaccine. It is important to recall that not being represented in MIIS does not necessarily mean someone has not received vaccine. \*\*Individuals who are partially vaccinated are those who have received at least one dose, but have not completed a primary series. \*\*\*Individuals fully vaccinated is counted as fully vaccinated if they have received the number of doses required to complete the primary series for their age and all of these doses have been reported to MIIS. 

## **Critical definitions**

Please note: the following terms and definition apply to COVID-19 only. Updated 9/20/2022.

**Doses administered:** All valid doses of Janssen/Johnson & Johnson, Moderna, Pfizer, and Novavax COVID-19 vaccine that have been given to people by providers and reported to MIIS are included in this measurement. Duplicate patient records may be created when patient information is not entered consistently. Data include doses administered by MA providers as well as through the Federal Pharmacy Partnership for Long-term Care Program and the retail pharmacies in the jurisdictional transfer program and Community Health Centers (CHCs) receiving vaccine from the U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). Some doses are administered as part of a separate federal distribution system and would not be included here.

Individuals with a least one dose: An individual is counted as at least one dose if they have received one or more doses of vaccine. This is measured as the total number of first doses of Moderna, Pfizer, and Novavax vaccine administered and reported, plus the total number of Janssen/Johnson & Johnson doses administered and reported.

Individuals who are fully vaccinated: An individual is counted as fully vaccinated if they have received the number of doses required to complete the primary series for their age and all of these doses have been reported to MIIS. Pfizer recipients under 5 years of age require three doses of vaccine; all other Pfizer recipients require two doses. Moderna and Novavax recipients require two doses of vaccine. Janssen/Johnson & Johnson recipients require one dose of vaccine.

**Booster doses administered:** On 8/13/21, a third dose was recommended for severely immunocompromised individuals to complete their primary series. These doses are counted as 'booster' doses. On 9/24/21, booster doses of Pfizer vaccine were recommended for individuals aged 65 and older, for those at risk for severed disease, or for those at high risk for occupational exposure six months after completing their primary series. On 10/22/21, booster doses of Moderna vaccine were recommended for the same population. Additionally, booster doses of any vaccine, including Johnson & Johnson, were recommended for everyone 18 years and older at least two months after receiving initial Johnson & Johnson vaccine. On 12/9/21, mix and match and Johnson & Johnson boosters were added to the booster counts, which redistributed shots that had previously been counted in other rows. This also adjusted for people who have completed a primary series and had previously been double counted. On 1/4/22, the Pfizer vaccine booster dose recommendation was revised to be five months after completing primary series. On 1/7/22, the Moderna vaccine booster dose recommendation was revised to be five months after completing primary series. On 3/29/22, second monovalent booster doses were recommended for adults aged 50 years and older.

On 9/1/22, bivalent boosters were recommended for everyone aged 12 years and older whose primary series or most recent booster dose were administered at least two months ago. This recommendation replaced all previous booster recommendations for this age group. Additional doses beyond second booster: Some individuals with certain health conditions are eligible to receive additional doses of vaccine. These doses are counted in this category. Individuals who are unvaccinated/unreported vaccination: This is the population estimate for the subpopulation minus the number of people who received at least one dose of vaccine. It is important to recall that not being represented in MIIS does not necessarily mean someone has not received vaccine.

**MIIS:** Immunization data from most (but not all) providers in Massachusetts are reported into the Massachusetts Immunization Information System (MIIS) through direct messages from electronic health records or direct entry by users. Due to inputting and processing, it may take 24-48 hours or more for shipping or administration data to appear in MIIS. MIIS data are available for analysis one calendar day after they are reported to the MIIS. Data are current as of time of publication and may be subject to change in future publications as additional data are reported. As of 11/4/21, MIIS numbers include vaccinations reported from the Veterans Administration for MA residents. MIIS does not include data on health states or occupations of individuals.
