DECISION

GRAPES & GRAINS INC. DBA QUEENSBORO WINE AND SPIRITS **26 MAIN STREET** WEST STOCKBRIDGE, MA 01266

Grapes & Grains Inc. dba Queensboro Wine and Spirits (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, July 22, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Kujawski's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
- 2. Investigator Kujawski's Compliance Check Field Report dated February 24, 2014; and
- 3. Photo of Underage Operative.
- A. Letter dated July 22, 2014.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On Monday, February 24, 2014, at approximately 5:00 p.m., Investigators Keefe and Kujawski conducted an investigation of the business operation of Grapes & Grains Inc. dba Queensboro Wine and Spirits.
- 2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage, a twelve ounce (12 oz.) can of Budweiser Light beer for one dollar and fifteen cents (\$1.15). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 - Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
