Wetlands Circuit Riders (CR) provide technical and regulatory assistance, training and outreach to conservation commissions, other local officials, wetland permit applicants and their consultants, environmental groups, watershed associations and state and federal agency staff. Since January 2019, MassDEP now has a Wetlands Circuit Rider in every region; Mark Stinson is in the western region, Kimberly Roth is in the northeast region, Judith Schmitz is in the central region and she also serves as the statewide Wetlands Data Manager. Andrew Poyant is the **new** southeast regional Wetlands Circuit Rider. Nancy Lin serves as the program manager providing guidance and support to the program and to the wetlands and waterways division.

Circuit Riders answer a wide variety of questions ranging from the simple to the complex on technical, procedural, or regulatory implementation of the Wetlands Protection Act.

By invitation Circuit Riders to attend regularly scheduled Commission meetings to provide them with regulatory, technical, and procedural assistance. Commissions receive tailored assistance ranging from presentations on specific topics of interest to informal Q & A sessions. They also provide technical assistance at field sites upon request.

Since 1988 Nancy has overseen the technical assistance, regulatory outreach and training for MassDEP's Division of Wetlands and Waterways, including grant writing and project management. Nancy also writes and reviews technical and regulatory guidance, policies and procedures for the Division's three programs. Prior to MassDEP, Nancy worked at the MA. Water Resources Authority; was the Director of the City of Cambridge's Conservation Commission; managed staff training for the New York City (NYC) Park Ranger program; and served as a naturalist/instructor at a National Environmental Education Landmark in NYC. Central Region: Judith Schmitz is the Circuit Rider for the Central Regional Office. Prior to working at MassDEP, Judy was the Conservation Agent for the Town of Middleton for three years. She also served for 12 years as a conservation commissioner for the town of Barre, including four years as their chair. Judy holds a B.S. in Civil Engineering with a concentration in Environmental Engineering from Duke University. She has taken graduate courses in botany, environmental science, and wildlife habitat. Judy has had extensive experience consulting for municipalities and applicants, and is knowledgeable in numerous wetland related topics including: wetlands delineation, wetlands replication and restoration, wildlife habitat analysis, pollution impact assessment, stormwater management and hydrology, erosion control monitoring, river determination, and vernal pool studies. She is also a certified Professional Wetland Scientist (PWS) from the Society of Wetland Scientists. Northeast Region: Kimberly Roth is the Circuit Rider for the Northeast Regional Office. Prior to joining MassDEP, Kim was the program manager for New England Interstate Water Pollution Control Commission's (NEIWPCC) wetlands projects. This work included coordinating the Wetlands Workgroup and the New England Biological Assessment of Wetlands Workgroup (NEBAWWG), groups that bring together representatives from state and federal agencies and other individuals to address issues of shared concern. NEBAWWG is one of many regional groups across the country working toward improved approaches for wetlands Program, providing support in wetlands compliance and enforcement, and in the Bureau of Waste Site Cleanup, where she researched information on site history and contamination. She also worked at the Mystic River Watershed Association on tasks related to watershed protection, brownfields, open space, water quality monitoring, and stormwater management. Southeast Region: Andrew Poyant is the Circuit Rider for the Southeast Regional Office. Prior to joining MassDEP, Andrew was a Town Planner and Conservation Agent for the Town of Rehoboth. Andrew also worked for ten years as an Environmental Scientist for the consulting firm of CDM Smith, with extensive experience in the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act, 401 Water Quality Certification, Chapter 91 Waterways, Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act, Massachusetts Coastal Zone Management Act, Natural Heritage and Endangered Species Program and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. He has broad field experience in wetland delineation, wetland functions and values assessments, vernal pool monitoring, and wildlife habitat assessments, construction monitoring of wetland restoration and replication, erosion and sedimentation control inspections, stormwater management and post construction wetland monitoring. Andrew holds a BS in Biology from UMass Dartmouth and a MS in Plant and Soil Science from UMass Amherst.
