


ASSESSMENT CHANGES

Updated Combined Report of Assessments: The updated report now includes the Career Cluster Inventory results and displays occupations in the user's three highest-rated clusters. Users can now select from two report options: Default, which automatically selects the most recent version of every assessment the user has taken, and Advanced, which allows the user to select which assessment results to include in the report. Features of the updated report include:

- Ability to view results by Occupation Cluster or by Occupation Count
- Ability to navigate to occupation descriptions by simply clicking on an occupation title
- Ability to save occupations on the report to Favorites by selecting the checkbox to the left of the occupation title
- A gold star appears next to occupations already saved to the user's Favorites
- Enhanced introductory instructional text



About Assessments: This new module teaches users about assessments, how to use assessments and interpret assessment results, and provides cautions in the use and interpretation of assessments.

Reality Check: This has been completely updated to facilitate usage and comprehension. Users can visit every expense category or use the top navigation bar to jump to different expenses. In addition, there is a new expense category for data and phone plans.

PERSONAL LEARNING PLANS

A new report, the <u>Personal Learning Plan</u>, encourages students' career and life planning activity in MassCIS and provides a clear and concise report of those efforts. This summary can help to facilitate academic and life decisions when used during student conferences. The report helps students, educators and family members see more clearly the student's goals and needs. The summary is designed for annual updating and captures a snapshot of the student's present goals. Most states and school districts require students to have some sort of personal learning plan. Report information is pulled from the student's:

- Résumé Creator



INTERFACE CHANGES

Site Administration Tools: The MassCIS Site Administration Tools have been redesigned. The interface now uses mega menu navigation which parallels the MassCIS interface. A dashboard has been added for quick access to key reports, password resetting, curriculum, and tutorials.



Portfolio: The Portfolio interface allows users to see, print or share all portfolio items. Users can expand categories of interest in order to see all items, completion status, and recommended activity.



CONTENT CHANGES

Job Success: Job Success has been updated and translated into Spanish this year adding important information about attaining success on the job. Written for those who are new to the workforce as well as those who have been working for many years, Job Success highlights:

- Good work habits
- The importance of teamwork
- How to overcome barriers in the workplace
- Resolving problems in the workplace
- Keeping your career on track

Occupations:

- Added a new page At a Glance which is now the landing page for all occupations (except emerging occupations). This page provides users a snap shot of the occupation (e.g. statewide wage and outlook data, preparation details, and working conditions). Users can easily navigate to the full Wage, Employment and Outlook, Preparation, or Working Conditions topics for more complete information.
- MASSCIS has 579 occupations as of fall 2014. 549 are standard occupations based on O*NET data and 30 are emerging occupations.
- The following emerging occupations are now full occupations: Climate Change Analysts, Exercise Physiologists, Sustainability Specialists, and Wind Turbine Technicians.
- ♣ The following occupations are new: Community Health Workers and Credit Counselors.
- ♣ The Wages topic includes a graphic representation of the wage data in addition to the numeric table.
- ♣ The Interests and Values topic now breaks Interests and Values into two separate lists.

Junior Occupations: 201 occupations have been added to the junior version of MassCIS for a total of 579 junior occupations. For each occupation in the high school version of MassCIS there is now a junior counterpart.
