DECISION

ROUND ROBIN OF WILBRAHAM LLC DBA RED ROBIN GOURMET BURGERS 2031 BOSTON RD WILBRAHAM, MA 01095

LICENSE#: 147200052 HEARD: 10/01/2013

Round Robin of Wilbraham LLC dba Red Robin Gourmet Burgers (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, October 1, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age.

Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Kenny's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
- 2. Investigator Kenny's Compliance Check Field Report dated May 20, 2013; and
- 3. Photo of Underage Operative.

FACTS

- 1. On Monday, May 20, 2013, at approximately 5:38 p.m., Investigators Teehan and Kenny conducted an investigation of the business operation of Round Robin of Wilbraham LLC dba Red Robin Gourmet Burgers.
- 2. An underage operative working with investigators purchased an alcoholic beverage, a container of beer, for three dollars and forty-five cents (\$3.45). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for two (2) days of which two (2) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
