**DECISION**

**VBB12, INC. DBA THE KING AND I**  
**2481 BOSTON ROAD**

VBB12, Inc. dba The King and I (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, June 24, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Keefe's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Investigator Keefe's Investigative Report dated February 26, 2014;
2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
3. Notice of Violation;
4. Picture of Underage Operative; and
5. Receipt of Sale dated February 26, 2014.

**FACTS**


1. On Wednesday, February 26, 2014 at approximately 7:24 p.m., Investigators Kujawski and Keefe conducted an investigation of the business operation of VBB12, Inc. dba The King and I.
2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased a bottle of Budweiser Light beer for three dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

### CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
