Off the Beaten Path Hike

Explore the lesser seen parts of the Wompatuck State Park. For families and curious adults.

June 16 — Triphammer Pond Loop

A 1.5-mile loop around Triphammer Pond. Minimal elevation gains. Rocky and uneven surfaces. Meet at the Visitor Center.

June 23 — Mt. Hope Loop

A 2-mile hike around Mount Hope. Moderate elevation gains with a mix of trail types. Meet at the Mount Blue Gate at the end of Union Street: proceed through the park main entrance at 204 Union St., Hingham. Continue on Union St. for two miles, until you reach the Mt. Blue Springs gate. Restrooms at park entrance.

June 30 — Doane Street Loop

A 3.5-mile hike through wooded areas, wetlands and open spaces as well as along the Aaron River Reservoir. Some moderate elevation gains. Paved roads and forest pathways. Meet at the Doane Street Entrance (198 Doane St., Cohasset). Restrooms not available.
