Line and Circle LLC dba NUF CED (the "Licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, March 1, 2011, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c.138, §34C. Prior to the commencement of the hearing the licensee stipulated to the facts detailed in Investigator Jan Kujawski's report.

- 2. Investigator Jan Kujawski's report; and
- 3. RMV Printout.

There is one (1) tape of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On Sunday December 19, 2010, Commission Investigators Kujawski, Bailey, and Keefe observed the business operation of Line N Circle, LLC dba NUF CED.
- 2. Investigators entered the premises and noticed a youthful looking male in possession of an alcoholic beverage.
- 3. The investigators asked the youthful individual to provide his identification.
- 4. He gave them his Massachusetts drivers' license which indicated that he was age twenty (20). The license he used to purchase the alcohol at the establishment was of another person five (5) years older than him.
- 5. Investigator Kujawski noted that the identification did not resemble the youthful individual.
- 6. Administrative review of the file indicates this is the first violation by the licensee.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated M.G.L. c.138, §34C. Therefore, the Commission issues a WARNING.
