## **DECISION**

Pypelyene, LLC dba Bluri Bar & Lounge (the "Licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on October 5, 2010 regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c.138, §34 (1 count) detailed in Investigator Dennis Keefe's Report that occurred on May 14, 2010.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Investigator Dennis Keefe's Report; and
2. Department of Motor Vehicles Demographic Information Sheet.

### Facts

1. On, May 14, 2010 at approximately 11:55 p.m., Commission Investigators and the alcohol unit of the Worcester Police Department investigated the business operation of Pypelyene, LLC dba Bluri Bar & Lounge.
2. Investigators Dennis Keefe and Jan Kujawski observed a young female patron in possession of a Bud Light bottle. The Investigators identified themselves and asked the individual for verification of her age. The individual was age twenty (20).
3. Investigators notified the Worcester Police Department and placed the female patron under arrest.
4. Investigators then notified the owners of the establishment of the violation. Both owners were very cooperative with the Investigators and the Worcester Police Department.

Conclusion

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated M.G.L. c.138, §34. The Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be served for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
