 - In MA, professionalizing equates with degrees, which cuts the workforce by 80%
 - Create a certification program through employer may be a more helpful solution
 - Chris- difficult in MA. Degree requirement would cut the workforce by 80%. Looking at some sort of certification through their employer.
 - Department of Labor recognizes DSP as a professional class, worthy of its own designation
 - ANCOR and the Associations of DSP are leading the charge.
 - Administration worked on certain requirements and training through MassHealth
 - May be a model to look at

- Providers Council has started certificate for DSPs: it is tailored for disability, mental health, substance issues.
