

Massachusetts Probation Service Summary of Supervision of Jorge A. Zambrano and Corrective Action Initiated by Probation Officer:

4/4/16 no show for scheduled appointment however Zambrano reported later that day and PO addressed in chrono and the need to comply w conditions (“PO explained that his actions or lack of actions influence his time on probation.”)

4/8/16 no show appointment in a.m. PO immediately called probationer and told him to report later that day between 3 and 3:30, when probationer stated he could not, he was directed to report the following Monday.

4/11/16 no show at appointment at 8:30. Probationer called at 9 a.m. stating he was on his way. PO met with him briefly when he reported, addressed missed visits and the need to be on time. ORAS-CSST completed.

4/11/16 probationer tested positive for cocaine (conducted by male PO) after probation appt. Probationer self-reports suboxone use (without prescription). PO notes in the chronos positive test to be addressed at next appointment. Probationer told to report again in 4 days on Friday 4/15/16 at 3:30.

4/15/16 probationer failed to report as directed at 3:30. PO contacted probationer prior to the end of the work day and directed him to report first thing in the morning the next business day on 4/19.

4/19/16 ORAS started, What I Want to Work On Questionnaire completed, Drug Abuse identified as an area Zambrano wanted to work on. PO notes she will “revisit with probationer at [a] later date when he may be more open to process.”

4/22/16 no show appointment in a.m. Probationer left PO message regarding medical emergency (asthma). PO spoke with probationer and told probationer to go to ER and report after. He reported at 4:15 same day. Probationer could not provide urine sample on that day (Friday), but admitted to recent use of cocaine. PO and probationer addressed treatment options. Probationer had no insurance. PO directed probationer to report to PO on Monday morning. PO also informed probationer that VOP would issue for non-compliance.

4/25/16 positive screen for cocaine and negative test for alcohol. VOP issued and probationer told to report to PO in 2 days (additional reporting and VOP notice are corrective actions taken by probation officer).

4/27/16 met with probationer and developed PICA.

5/3/16 Probationer no show for scheduled appointment at 8:30, but reported at 9:30. PO met with probationer and probationer told he must return the next day, 5/4.

5/4/16 probationer reported and tested NEGATIVE for drugs and alcohol.

5/10/16 home visit conducted by PO. Probationer had verification of having attended MH intake and having scheduled next appointment for full evaluation.

5/11/16 probationer appears in court for arraignment on Violation of Probation, final hearing scheduled for 6/9/16.

5/13/16 ORAS assessment completed and Risk/Need Supervision plan submitted to Assistant Chief Probation Officer for review

5/16/16 probationer released on personal recognizance following arrest on new charges, PO amends notice and serves the probationer and directs him to report on 5/17 for a drug screen following his appearance in the Clinton DC.

5/17/16 probationer called the PO and left two voicemail messages stating he was en route. Probationer never appeared.

5/18 office visit, PO and probationer discussed new charges, probationer states he is "struggling to keep doing the right thing." PO pointed out that he needs to be honest in every part of his life for things to fall into place. Probationer appears to be trying but struggling. PO gave probationer positive reinforcement. Probationer tested NEGATIVE for all substances,
