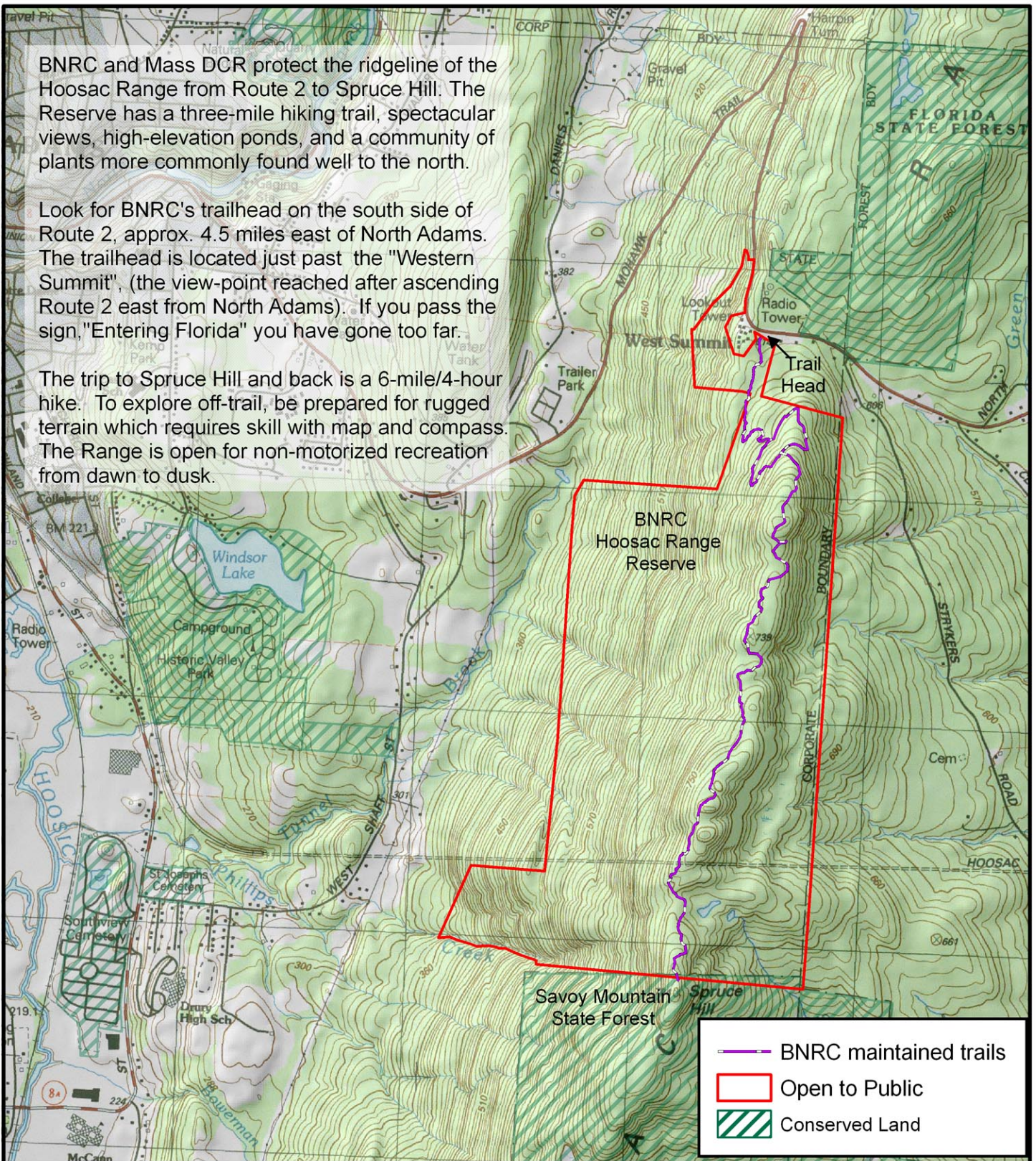


BNRC and Mass DCR protect the ridgeline of the Hoosac Range from Route 2 to Spruce Hill. The Reserve has a three-mile hiking trail, spectacular views, high-elevation ponds, and a community of plants more commonly found well to the north.

Look for BNRC's trailhead on the south side of Route 2, approx. 4.5 miles east of North Adams. The trailhead is located just past the "Western Summit", (the view-point reached after ascending Route 2 east from North Adams). If you pass the sign, "Entering Florida" you have gone too far.

The trip to Spruce Hill and back is a 6-mile/4-hour hike. To explore off-trail, be prepared for rugged terrain which requires skill with map and compass. The Range is open for non-motorized recreation from dawn to dusk.
