Update on May 28, 2015 Public Hearing ¹ DMF's Proposal to Adjust Commercial Gulf of Maine Groundfish Closures

The Division of Marine Fisheries (*MarineFisheries*) is scheduled to hold a <u>public hearing</u> on Thursday, May 28, 2015. At this public hearing, comments will be accepted on adjusting Massachusetts' existing Gulf of Maine commercial groundfish closures to better protect known cod spawning aggregations and reduce cod fishing mortality. To meet this goal, *MarineFisheries* is proposing to amend both the existing spring/summer and fall/winter closures. These proposed closures are depicted below:



All state-waters north of 42°20' to NH/MA border would be closed to commercial groundfish fishing.






All state-waters between 42°00' and 42°30' west of 70°24' would be closed to commercial groundfish fishing.

The proposed closures would seasonally prevent commercial groundfish fishing in certain state-waters within the Gulf of Maine. During the period of <u>April 1 through June 30</u> all state-waters north of 42°20' to the MA/NH border would be closed to commercial groundfish fishing. Then during the period of <u>October 1 through January 31</u> all state-waters between 42°00' and 42°30' west of 70°24' would be closed to commercial groundfish fishing. Certain gears would be exempt from these proposed commercial groundfish closures. These exempt gears include the commercial use of hooks and lines for the purpose of catching dogfish, bluefish, striped bass, mackerel and Atlantic bluefin tuna; pot and trap gear; sea scallop, ocean quahog and surf clam dredges; and cast nets, surface gillnets and purse seines. These exempt gears align with the federally exempt gears that may be active in the statewaters portion of Massachusetts Bay.

The proposed closures would replace *MarineFisheries*' longstanding "rolling" closures. The historic rolling closures closed all state-waters between 42°00' and 42°30' during April, May, October and November and all state-waters between 42°30' and the MA/NH border during April, May, and June. The proposed closures differ from the state's historic rolling closures in ways described below:



Would maintain existing closure for all state-waters north of 42°20', but would open previously closed area between 42°00' and 42°20'.



Would maintain existing closure for all state-waters between 42°00' and 42°30'west of 70°24', and open previously closed area east of 70°24'.



Would maintain existing closure for all state-waters north of 42°30', but would close previously open area between 42°20' and 42°30'.



Would enact new closure in all state-waters between 42°00' and 42°30'west of 70°24'.

The proposed closures would match the closures enacted by the New England Fishery Management Council and the National Marine Fisheries Service as part of Framework 53, but with additional protection for spawning cod during April and June. The proposed closures would apply to any commercial fisherman using non-exempt gears, including but not limited to state-water groundfish endorsement permit holders and federal "sector" or "common pool" vessels.
