

Substance Abuse and Offenders

- Current Sentenced MA DOC Inmate Population
 - 75% population has a Substance Abuse Need based on the Texas Christian University Drug Screen
 - ☐ 73% of those with a high risk to recidivate have a need for substance abuse treatment.
- Evidenced Based Treatment programs can reduce Recidivism
 - Massachusetts Results First Initiative Found:
 - Modified Therapeutic Communities- Drug Treatment
 - □ Have a net benefit of \$8,986 per participant
 - □ For every dollar invested we see a \$6.27 return
 - □ Result in a 9.7% reduction in crime

Types of Substance Abuse Treatment

Residential

- Modified Therapeutic Community
- Healthy Living Community (Female offender)

Non-Residential

- □ Substance Abuse Education
- Seeking Safety (Female offender)

Maintenance

- Treatment Support (Graduate Maintenance or Gateway to Treatment)
- Medication Assisted Treatment Reentry Initiative (MATRI)

Aftercare

In the community

Aftercare: A Warm Handoff to the Community

- MassHealth
 - ■Application sent prior to release
- Medication Assisted Treatment Reentry Initiative
 - □Prior to release, 1st injection of Vivitrol
 - □Post release referral Suboxone, Methadone
- Referrals
 - □First appointment in community scheduled prior to release
- Recovery Support Navigators
 - ■Ability to follow up with clients in the community
 - □Continuation of counseling post release

Challenges and Strategies

- Gaps in Treatment for Releasing Inmates (From July 2014- December 2014 Releases)
 - Inmates with an assessed substance abuse need:
 - 42% completed a residential treatment program
 - 15% completed a non residential treatment program
 - 37% of those with a need were not housed at a facility with a substance abuse program
 - □ Goal- 70% to complete substance abuse treatment prior to release by July 2017
- Inmates in the right program at the right time
 - Expand incentives to enroll in programming
 - 25% declined
 - 22% terminated
- Partners in the community
