Subject:	Guidance and Resources Available for Hurricane Impacted Individuals
Purpose:	To notify Local Workforce Boards, One-Stop Career Center Operators and other local workforce partners of guidance and resources for individuals impacted by Hurricanes Irma and Maria.
Background:	In the wake of the devastating impacts of Hurricanes Irma and Maria, individuals from Puerto Rico and U.S. Virgin Islands who seek refuge within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts may be in need of various services. Resources for assisting individuals are provided below.
	<b>BASIC ASSISTANCE:</b> Food, clothing, housing, health care, information on accessing schools, etc.
	Family Resource Centers (FRCs) provide customers with valuable resources for basic assistance during this difficult time. The Executive Office of Health and Human Services (EOHHS) has asked Family Resource Centers across the state to provide coordination for individuals and families affected by hurricanes Irma and Maria. FRCs are located in each of the 14 Massachusetts counties to provide easy access to information and assistance related to health care, safety, employment training, education and peer support. Mass 2-1-1, (http://mass211.org) is an information and referral line that provides free, confidential information to individuals and families seeking child and elder care, emergency food and shelter, substance abuse treatment, and educational and vocational assistance. Individuals in need of any of these services can dial 2-1-1 from any phone in Massachusetts to speak with an information and referral specialist 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Translation services are available in more than 140 languages.

**<u>UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS</u>**: Assistance is available for individuals filing for Unemployment Insurance or Disaster Unemployment Assistance with Puerto Rico.

Individuals inquiring about filing a Disaster Unemployment Assistance claim should be instructed to first file an initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claim online with Puerto Rico or through the Puerto Rico unemployment call center (787-945-7900) since the individual must first be determined *ineligible for regular unemployment benefits* before it can be determined whether they are eligible for the Disaster benefits.

- Encourage an evacuee to file online at "<u>http://www.trabajo.pr.gov/</u>. An initial UI claim can be filed by clicking on the button titled "Reclamacion Inicial" and a continued claim can be filed by clicking on "Reclamacion Semanas Subsiguientes."
- Individuals who do not have internet access can call Puerto Rico's unemployment call center at 787-945-7900 to file a regular, initial claim or to file a continued claim.

**MA Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA)** staff can assist individuals in person or over the phone to access the Puerto Rico system. For help, refer individuals who cannot use the online system to the designated phone number, 877-355-1135, where a Spanish speaking agent will provide assistance in completing the Disaster benefit application.

**EMPLOYMENT AND LICENSING:** Career Centers are the primary resource for employment assistance for individuals impacted by the hurricanes who are relocating to Massachusetts temporarily or permanently.

**NOTE**: Family Resource Centers need assistance from Career Centers to go onsite at the FRC to meet with families to assist with enrollment in the Career Centers for supportive employment and access to UI. Refer to the list of FRCs in Attachment A.

**Registration in MOSES**: Career Centers serving impacted individuals should register the customer in MOSES and click on *Career Center Specific* tab and enroll the individual under **PR Hurricane Impacted**. Refer to instructions in MassWorkforce Issuances 100 DCS 02-119 and 100 DCS 02-121 (https://www.mass.gov/files/documents/2017/11/03/02-119.pdf and https://www.mass.gov/files/documents/2017/11/16/02-121.pdf). Provide and record appropriate reemployment program, services, activities and supports in MOSES.

Make sure to identify any valid **professional licenses**, **certifications** or **registrations** that the individual may have on the **Education Tab**. This information will be helpful if reciprocal licensing with Massachusetts is being sought. To find out if a professional license from Puerto Rico is valid for working in Massachusetts, individuals should contact the appropriate Board office through the Division of Professional Licensure (DPL). DPL, through its 39 boards, licenses individuals and regulates businesses in some 167 trades and professions. https://www.mass.gov/orgs/division-of-professional-licensure.
