## DCR Traffic Advisory: Coastal Parkways in Greater Boston

**WHAT:** On Thursday, January 4, 2018, the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) anticipates temporary lane restrictions and road closures along several agency parkways in the Greater Boston area because of coastal flooding due to an astronomical mid-day high tide.

Additionally, there will be a parking ban in effect along several DCR parkways starting at 7:00AM tomorrow and continuing into Friday, January 5, 2018. The parking ban will be lifted once snowstorm cleanup activities have been completed. Temporary parking will be available for those with a valid City of Boston South Boston Resident Parking Sticker at the Castle Island parking lot.

**WHERE:** Anticipated lane restrictions and roadway closures:

- Morrissey Boulevard in the City of Boston
- Quincy Shore Drive in the City of Quincy
- Winthrop Parkway at Short Beach in the City of Revere
- Nahant Causeway in the Town of Nahant and the City of Lynn

Parking bans, include:

- Lynn Shore Drive in the City of Lynn
- Quincy Shore Drive in the City of Quincy
- Revere Beach Boulevard in the City of Revere

- Shore Road in the City of Boston
- William Day Boulevard in the City of Boston
- Winthrop Shore Drive in the Town of Winthrop
