Demonstration Grants to Address the Opioid Crisis - Call for Ideas

Purpose: The Department of Career Services is seeking input from local areas with regard

to the National Health Emergency (NHE) Dislocated Worker Demonstration Grants to Address the Opioid Crisis as described in the Department of Labor (DOL) Employment and Training Administration (ETA) Training and Employment Guidance Letter (TEGL) No. 12-17 released March 20, 2018.

Background: DOL/ETA is launching a two-phase, multi-year approach, utilizing grant funds to

combat the economic and workforce impacts associated with the opioid health crisis, as well as encourage more individuals to enter professions that could address the crisis. The first phase is the demonstration project. DOL plans to conduct a second phase in Program Year 2018, pending availability of funds.

Application Deadline: July 31, 2018 – electronically via <u>www.grants.gov</u>

Award Range: \$500,000 - \$5,000,000

Expected Number of Awards: 7 to 10 **Period of Performance:** 24 months

Eligible Applicants: State workforce agencies; outlying areas; and

Indian tribal governments

Eligible Participants:

Workers directly or indirectly affected by the opioid crisis or Workers seeking to enter professions that could help in addressing the opioid crisis and its cause

NHE demonstration grants will be awarded to eligible applicants that propose innovative approaches for addressing the economic and workforce-related impacts on communities affected by the opioid epidemic. Partnerships between the workforce system and other agencies will be central to these projects. **The goals of these grants are to:**

- Test innovative approaches to address the economic and workforce-related impacts of the opioid epidemic;
- Provide training and support activities to dislocated workers (including displaced homemakers), new entrants in the workforce, and incumbent workers, including individuals in these populations who are or have been impacted by the opioid crisis; and
- To provide training that builds the skilled workforce in professions that could impact the causes and treatment of the opioid crisis, including addiction and substance-abuse treatment, mental health, and pain management.

Please review TEGL 12-17 in its entirety. If your local area is interested in submitting a project idea for consideration, please develop a 2-3 page summary of the proposed project using the attached template.

EOLWD, DCS and Partners will review and consider all submissions with the goal of configuring 1-3 local proposed project ideas into an application for the MA Opioid Demonstration project.
