## TELEMEDICINE PILOT INITIATIVES Heywood Hospital



## **CARE MODEL**

Heywood Hospital implemented a collaborative school-based tele-behavioral health initiative in collaboration with the local school system to bridge gaps in care for adolescents with unmet behavioral health needs. The initiative provides counseling services in the schools through remote video consultations between the students and mental health clinicians at one of Heywood's partner organizations, with the additional support of a guidance counselor who serves as the care coordinator and facilitator of the visits. The program builds upon Heywood Hospital's work to expand access to behavioral health services in their community to students through the HPC's CHART investment program.



In 2016, the Massachusetts Health Policy Commission (HPC) launched its \$1.8 million Telemedicine Pilots pathway of the Health Care Innovation Investment (HCII) Program. The Telemedicine Pilots aim to demonstrate the potential of telemedicine to address critical behavioral health care access challenges in high-need and underserved target populations. The four 12-month pilots provide expanded access to behavioral health care for children and adolescents, individuals with Substance Use Disorder (SUD), and older adults aging in place. The Massachusetts Health Policy Commission (HPC), established in 2012, is an independent state agency charged with monitoring health care spending growth in Massachusetts and providing data-driven policy recommendations regarding health care delivery and payment system reform.
