Text-to-911 Information Resources

Please see our website, <u>www.mass.gov/e911</u>, for documents designed to assist PSAPs in educating communities about Text-to-911. When using Text-to-911, it is important for people to keep in mind the following:

- To use Text-to-911, the mobile device requires an active telephone number with a carrier and an active texting/data plan.
- Type the numbers "911" into the "To" or "Recipient" field of a new text message. Do not place dashes between the numbers.
- Text what is happening and what assistance you may need—police, fire or an ambulance.
- Text the location of the emergency, including the address and town name;
- Text any details that may help locate you, such as landmarks, cross streets, nearby business names, apartment number, floor, room or suite numbers.
- Text locations provided by carriers are not the same, or as accurate, as the location received when a voice call is made.
- If Text-to-911 is temporarily unavailable in the area you are sending a message from, wireless carriers send a bounceback message. The message will advise you to contact emergency services by other means, such as a voice call.
- When your message has been received, the 9-1-1
 professionals will send you messages and begin asking
 questions about the emergency you reported, and may
 provide instructions on things for you to do.
- You cannot send emojis, pictures or videos to 911.
- You cannot send a group text-to-911 and other people.
- Remember, at any time, you can make a voice call to 911. If you cannot speak, the 9-1-1 professional will try to communicate with you using another means.

Updates from Systems Division

Automatic Retransmits

As first announced in the November 2018, on January 30, 2019, automatic retransmits within the Next Generation 9-1-1 network will be enabled. This means that the system will query the carrier for a new location automatically every 30 seconds.


Automatic retransmits will occur for any **text or voice call** including landline, wireless, Telematics, and Voice Over Internet Protocol.

What will the telecommunicator see?

As automatic retransmits are performed, the telecommunicator will see the following:

- Latitude and longitude data, and confidence factors change within the ALI Results tab of CallStation;
- Messages within the Event tab of CallStation for each retransmit— "ALI Data received for call number XXX-XXX-XXXX" (ANI will be listed);
- Multiple probable location circles surrounding the wireless location within the mapped display of ResponseAssist;
- Change in size of the shaded radius around the mapped location and a change in meters distance;
- Multiple bars at the bottom of the Incident Tile, representing the most recent four locations provided by the carrier and the original location, as seen in the image to the right.

Please note that if RapidSOS data is available and is displayed within CallStation and ResponseAssist, it is already querying for new location data every 30 seconds and displaying as available.

New Automatic Call Distributor (ACD) Feature

By the beginning of February, Genovation keypads at the ACD PSAPs will undergo a renovation!

With the implementation of automatic retransmits, the decision was made to modify the ACD keypad to now include **Ready and Not Ready buttons**—and remove the "Retrans ALI" and "Clear" buttons. Pictured here is the new layout of the ACD Genovation keypads.


Genovation keypads at Ring-all PSAPs will not be effected with this change.

Wireless Direct Program

The State 911 Department is happy to report 205 participating PSAPs, and 318 communities now covered as part of the Wireless Direct Program, shaded in BLUE on the map below. We applaud these PSAPs who are improving 9-1-1 for the citizens they serve! There are currently 23 PSAPs remaining to be converted to Wireless Direct, which represents 33 communities.

Running Reports: Changes within DecisionStation

With the implementation of Motorola CallWorks (MCWs) newest DecisionStation application, it has been found that the criteria for running some reports has changed. Some reports now require you to select the "skill set" dispatch group rather than the "routing" dispatch group. It has been found that if you select the wrong dispatch group option, you may get no results when the report is run.

In an effort to eliminate confusion, the State 911 Department no longer retains copies of reimbursement requests that are returned to PSAPs. All documentation will be returned to the PSAP; only the return letter will be retained for the grant file.



With five (5) months remaining in the FY19 grant cycle, PSAPs should review their approved applications to ensure all certified telecommunicators for whom they may request reimbursement are listed on that application. Authorized signatories may add additional certified telecommunicators by submitting a request to 911DeptGrants@mass.gov.



PSAPs are reminded that detailed invoices are required with submission of reimbursements. PSAPs should work with its vendors to ensure that invoice(s) detail the goods and/or services received and does not simply reference a quote/contract number.



Please note PSAPs are required to complete the check date column on the reimbursement form. PSAPs should ensure that this column is updated with each submission and reconciles with the payroll documents attached to the reimbursement request.



FY2020 Regional Development grant applications are due on or before <u>5:00 PM on Friday, March 1, 2019.</u>

Budget Modifications under the FY 2019 Support and Incentive Grant and the Training and EMD/Regulatory Compliance Grant are due on or before **Friday, March 29, 2019.**


