

Two Major Categories of Subcontractors that sign contracts directly with the Construction Manager (referred to as First Tier Subcontractors)

- Filed Sub-Bid Subcontractors- c.149A, §8 (a)-(i) prequalification process, c.149, §44F for bidding
- Non-Filed Sub-Bid Subcontractors c.149A, §8 (j)



Filed Sub-Bid Subcontractors

- ✓ DCAMM Certification is required for filed sub-bid subcontractors working in any of 18 filed sub-bid trades (when ECC of work is >\$25,000)
- ✓ Prequalification process as defined in law is required. Committee with DCAMM, Designer, CM members.
- ✓ Bonding is required by law.
- ✓ Bids submitted to DCAMM public bidding process.
- ✓ Lowest eligible & responsible bidder selected.



Filed Sub-bid Trade Categories (any of these 18 trades-c.149A,§8 & c.149, § 44F)

- (a) roofing and flashing;
- (b) metal windows;
- (c) waterproofing, damp-proofing and caulking;
- (d) miscellaneous and ornamental iron;
- (e) lathing and plastering;
- (f) acoustical tile;
- (g) marble;
- (h) tile;
- (i) terrazzo
- (j) resilient floors;
- (k) glass and glazing;
- (I) painting;
- (m) plumbing;
- (n) heating, ventilating and air-conditioning;
- (o) electrical work;
- (p) elevators;
- (q) masonry work; and
- (r) fire protection sprinkler systems





Non-Filed Sub-Bid Subcontractors

- ✓ Prequalification process conducted by CM.
- ✓ Bonding not required by law, usually required by CM's Surety.
- ✓ CM conducts procurement process with input from DCAMM.
- ✓ Subcontractor price proposals submitted to CM and provided to DCAMM.



Second Tier+ Subcontractors

Filed Sub-Bid Subcontractors

Current procurement laws as interpreted restrict those portions of work that can be sub-sub contracted out to second tier subcontractors – only to work that is customarily subcontracted out for the particular trade (often referred to as paragraph E work) and "non-core" work.

Non-Filed Sub-Bid Subcontractors

Above referenced statutory restrictions do not apply.

Third Tier+ Subcontractors and Suppliers

Above referenced statutory restrictions do not apply.
