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- 1. Consideration of the September 26, 2022, meeting minutes.
- P. Malagrifa made a motion, J. Colleary seconded, and the members present unanimously voted to approve the minutes with correction of abstention on the Executive Minutes.

2. Reviewed/Discussed other reports:

- a) **Executive Director Report** Deputy Commissioner Esther Laine stated that she is covering for Keith while he is on leave, but there was nothing to report otherwise to the Board.
- b) Office of Investigations No matters reported
- c) Legal Counsel Counsel Kilb introduced Jennifer Cargill as new Board Counsel in an agency wide redistribution of assignments, but he would be attending the December meeting. Counsel Cargill addressed the Board indicating that prior to DOL she worked for 10 years at the Department of public utilities.
- d) **Board of Fire Prevention Regulations** P. Vigneau reported that the Board of Fire Prevention Regulations approved the 2023 electrical code with MA amendments on October 6. It went to the Building Code Coordinating Council where it was approved for promulgation as part of the 562 process. Also, public hearing was held on the fire code and will be available in red line version with cooperation from the Secretary of the Commonwealth. The two codes should be effective as scheduled in January 2023.
