Apprenticeship is an industry-driven, high-quality career pathway where employers can develop and prepare their future workforce, and individuals receive:



# Operations



Sponsors must properly submit all required information and documentation upon application and throughout the term of the apprenticeship, including:

- ✓ Program and Apprentice Registrations.
- ✓ Sponsor and Apprentice status updates.
- Document submission and storage.
- ✓ Annual program and apprentice Renewals.
- Creating accounts/linking established programs.
- ✓ Registering apprentices and entering agreements.
- Processing fee transactions.

### **Training**

Regularly scheduled, interactive ePLACE trainings are conducted on system functionality.

**User Guides** have been created for each process and can be sent to any authorized contact.

## As part of that oversight, the Division of Apprentice Standards:


- ✓ Provides Sponsor Technical Assistance
